



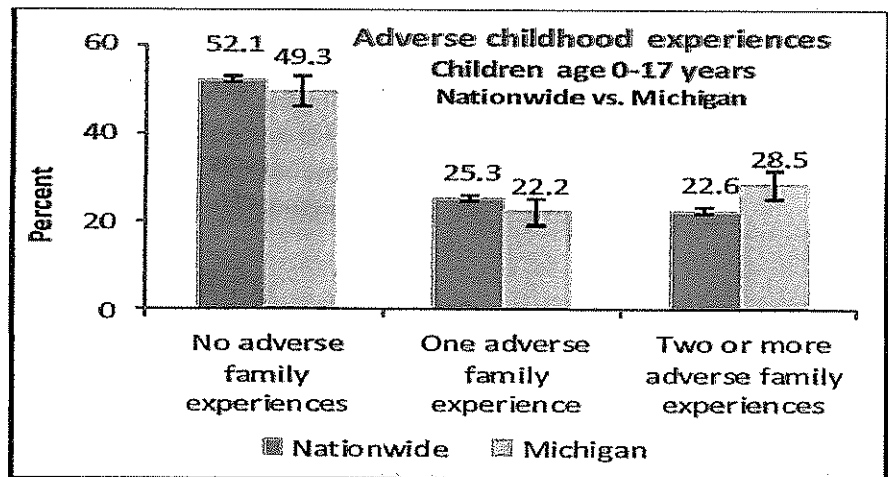
"It's one thing to build trauma specific responses; it's another to build resiliency, hope, and wellness."

A Look at Michigan's Challenge:

- Flint and Detroit have among the highest homicide rates in the nation at 62 and 48 per 100,000 respectively. The homicide rate in Detroit alone is nearly 7 times the national average.
- FBI data shows that Flint, Detroit, Saginaw and Pontiac rank among the nation's top 10 most violent cities.
- 46% of Michigan's adults experienced 1-3 Adverse Childhood Experiences as children, representing over 2.4 million people.
- Michigan specific data from the 2012 U.S. DHHS Child Maltreatment report shows that over half of CPS reports occurred in the context of reported domestic violence.
- Of the 80,117 CPS investigations in 2014, a total of 21,049 complaints were confirmed, representing 30,953 identified victims of CA/N; 38% of victims were < age 4.

Michigan's Strategies:

- ❖ **Breakthrough Series Collaborative** – Focused collaboration between local DHHS and CMH to scale up trauma screening, assessment, treatment.
- ❖ **Children's Trauma Initiative** – Offers training for CMH Service Providers on trauma screening, assessment and TF-CBT.
- ❖ **MDHHS Contracts** – Many include language on trauma-informed care and protective factors.
- ❖ **Grants** – Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems, Project AWARE, Safe Schools/Healthy Students
