

## **IWGYP: ACTIVITIES**

- Primary focus: Youth ages 10-24
- Create and support a federal interagency website on youth: youth.gov
- Identify and disseminate effective strategies and practices that support youth
- Promote enhanced collaboration at the federal, state, and local levels
- Develop an overarching strategic plan for federal youth policy

### **SUCCESS THROUGH TRANSITIONS**

- Develop a common vision and plan
- Engage in relevant work (active engagement; short- and long-term activities; look forward)
- Build relationships and develop partnerships
- Brief leadership and staff
- Involve career staff



### **PATHWAYS FOR YOUTH**

#### A strengths-based vision for youth

- Youth have strong, positive, stable connections to family, peers, school, supportive adults, and community.
- Youth are recognized by their community for their strengths and provided multiple opportunities for civic engagement, service, and leadership.



### **PATHWAYS FOR YOUTH**

Goal 1: Collaboration and coordination Goal 2: Evidence-based and innovative strategies Goal 3: Youth engagement and partnerships



### **IWGYP: PHILOSOPHY**

#### Positive Youth Development (PYD) approach

- "Problem-free ≠ fully prepared"
- Young people are resources to be developed, not problems to be managed
- Does not replace the focus on prevention of problem behavior, but promotes positive outcomes for all youth

### **IWGYP: PYD ACTIVITIES**

- Developed youth.gov web content on PYD
- Created a cross-agency definition of PYD
- Developed a research agenda on PYD

## WHY DEVELOP A PYD RESEARCH AGENDA?

- Identify research gaps
- Guide for students and researchers
- Bridge research and practice
- Facilitate collaboration
- Improve quality
- Identify funding priorities

### **PYD RESEARCH AGENDA: DEVELOPMENT**

#### Consensus-building process

- Surveyed federal staff
- AIR literature review
- Convened federal staff for 2-day meeting
- Feedback from staff
- Feedback from experts in the field

### **IWGYP PYD WORK: NEXT STEPS**

- Incorporating a PYD approach into agency materials
- Organizing PYD briefing for interagency youth homelessness group
- Developing PYD webcasts for training (connections, brain development)
- Updating youth.gov PYD content and creating hub
- Disseminating the PYD Research Agenda
  - Peer-review manuscript under review
  - Connecting with international colleagues
