

Coordinating Council on Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Meeting Subcommittee on Programs and Practice

Overview

The Coordinating Council on Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention's Programs and Practice Subcommittee has met two times—October 25 and November 20—since the last full Coordinating Council meeting on September 19, 2023. The subcommittee gained new participants and now includes a total of twenty-seven members, representing eleven federal offices, one independent organization, and six practitioners from the field.

Discussions over the course of the subcommittee's two most recent meetings have focused primarily on finalizing goals and objectives, and planning for a Coordinating Council-sponsored track at the 2024 OJJDP National Conference, which will be held in Washington, D.C., on November 19–21.

Programs and Practice Subcommittee Goals and Objectives

The subcommittee's newly-developed goals and objectives are provided in an attachment to this document for the full Council's review. The group is currently working to prioritize these objectives in advance of its January 2024 meeting.

Coordinating Council Sponsored Conference Track for 2024 OJJDP National Conference

Giving careful consideration to recommendations from the Council's October 2022 youth panel, the Programs and Practice Subcommittee has proposed 14 sessions for possible inclusion in the Coordinating Council's conference track. Collectively, these session proposals cover a wide variety of topical areas including: youth mental health; addressing trauma and implementing trauma-informed approaches; connecting with the Interagency Work Group for Youth Programs (IWGYP) on youth.gov and Map My Community; sharing research, data, evidence-based interventions, flexible funding models, and supportive resources for communities serving multi-risk youth, families, and communities; federal programs/initiatives focusing on programs and resources and how to access them; opening up opportunities for system-involved youth; federal support for vulnerable populations, such as youth with disabilities, LGBTQ+ youth, youth experiencing homelessness, tribal youth, etc; engaging community voice; and uplifting programs/innovative approaches.

Recommendation:

- The subcommittee recommends approval of the attached 14 conference session proposals for possible inclusion in the Coordinating Council track at OJJDP's National Conference in November 2024. Upon approval, members will continue work with conference planners to prioritize and refine the Council's session proposals.
