## What is the 4-H **Program?**

4-H has a rich history of being a leader in positive youth development experiences for more than a century.

4-H is the youth outreach program of the USDA. Implemented by the **Cooperative Extension System** through over 110 LAND-GRANT **COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES** across the United States and its territories.

**CONDUCTED AT THE** STATE AND LOCAL LEVEL. **4-H REACHES MORE** THAN **6 M YOUTH** 2.6M RURAL 1.8M URBAN **1.6M SUBURBAN** 

**DELIVERED BY 3,500 COOPERATIVE EXTENSION PROFESSIONALS** 

**500,000 TRAINED VOLUNTEERS**

## **4-H and Member Definition**



"All youth programming in Extension is by definition 4-H and that the preferred name for Extension Youth Development **Programming is 4-H Youth Development**". - ECOP, March 2018

"A 4-H Member is a youth who participates in any educational program or activity delivered by Cooperative Extension and/or receives Cooperative Extension-based curriculum. 4-H Member includes a youth who is 'Individually Enrolled' or 'Group Enrolled', regardless of the type of 4-H engagement/delivery method in which they are participating". - PLWG, June 2019


